- Q1. Write the color used for the following: water bodies, mountain, plateau and for plains.
- Ans. Blue is used for showing water bodies, brown for mountain, yellow for plateau and green is used for plains.
- Q2. What is called the north line?
- Ans. Most maps contain an arrow marked with the letter 'N' at the upper right hand corner. This arrow shows the north direction. It is called the north line.
- Q3. What do you mean by Thematic Maps?
- Ans. Some maps focus on specific information; such as road maps, rainfall maps, maps showing distribution of forests, industries etc. are known as thematic maps.
- Q4. What are called conventional symbols?
- Ans. Symbols give a lot of information in a limited space. There is an international agreement regarding the use of these symbols. These are called conventional symbols.
