## Natural Vegetation and Wild Life

Q1. Discuss the different types of forests.

Ans. Different types of forests found in India are:

<u>Tropical Evergreen Forests</u> - These forests are also called tropical rainforests. These thick forests occur in the regions near the equator and close to the tropics. These regions are hot and receive heavy rainfall throughout the year.

<u>Tropical Deciduous Forests</u> - Tropical deciduous are the monsoon forests found in the large part of India, northern Australia and in Central America. These regions experience seasonal changes. Trees shed their leaves in the dry season to conserve water.

<u>Temperate Evergreen Forests</u> - The temperate evergreen forests are located in the mid latitudinal coastal region. They are commonly found along the eastern margin of the continents, e.g., In south east USA, South China and in South East Brazil. They comprise both hard and soft wood trees.

<u>Temperate Deciduous Forests</u> - These are found in the north eastern part of USA, China, New Zealand, Chile and also found in the coastal regions of Western Europe. They shed their leaves in the dry season.

<u>Mediterranean Vegetation</u> - It is mostly found in the areas around the Mediterranean Sea in Europe, Africa and Asia. These regions are marked for hot dry summers and mild rainy winters. Citrus fruits such as oranges, figs, olives and grapes are commonly cultivated here.

<u>Coniferous Forests</u> - In the higher latitudes (50° – 70°) of Northern hemisphere the spectacular Coniferous forests are found. These are also called as Taiga. They are tall, softwood evergreen trees.
