## Understanding Our Criminal Justice System

Q1. Explain the following terms: accused, cognizable, cross-examine, detention, impartial, Offence and witness

Ans. <u>Accused</u>: In the context of this chapter this refers to the person who is tried by a court for a crime.

<u>Cognizable</u>: In the context of this chapter this refers to an offence for which the police may arrest a person without the permission of the court.

<u>Cross-examine</u>: In the context of this chapter this refers to the questioning of a witness who has already been examined by the opposing side in order to determine the veracity of his/her testimony.

<u>Detention</u>: In the context of this chapter this refers to the act of being kept in illegal custody by the police.

<u>Impartial</u>: The act of being fair or just and not favouring one side over another.

Offence: Any act that the law defines as a crime.

<u>To be charged of a crime</u>: This refers to the trial judge informing the accused, in writing, of the offence for which he/she will face trial.

<u>Witness</u>: In the context of this chapter this refers to the person who is called upon in court to provide a first-hand account of what he/she has seen, heard or knows.
